Dear Nigel,

Hope you are well.

I have looked at the gateway locations you described, I could find 2 locations, not sure where the 3rd one is. We only install gateways where the speed terminals change, and because we don't have time now to visit site, I have looked on google streetview. The only advice I can give is that we have to be mindful when installing

gateways that we aren't going to be obscuring any accesses, and we have to leave a minimum width of 450mm from the road for car mirrors etc.

The smallest gateway we offer is 960mm wide, and these tend to be blank gateways that sit in front of a existing roundel and post, as they are too small to mount anything on. Looking at the first location (Costessy Rd & The Street junction where it goes from a 40-20mph), I would be mindful of the access to the left, and the fact the verge is very steep, so would suggest we could only install 1 gateway on the other side. From google street view, it looks like we could possibly fit a 1500mm gateway with a village name plate & roundel mounted on, but wouldn't want to say for definite without measuring it.

The other location (Ringland Lane and Taverham Lane 40-60mph junction) it looks too narrow to install any gateways on the right hand side, but could possibly on the left, as long as it wasn't causing any obstructions at the junction.

As a rule of thumb, I tend to quote £2000 for 1no. 1500mm gateway, and £1000 for 1no. 960mm blank gateway.

With that in mind, if you think your locations are suitable, you can submit a bid in before Friday if you wish to go ahead with the gateways.

I hope this makes sense! Let me know if you need any further info.
